Admission

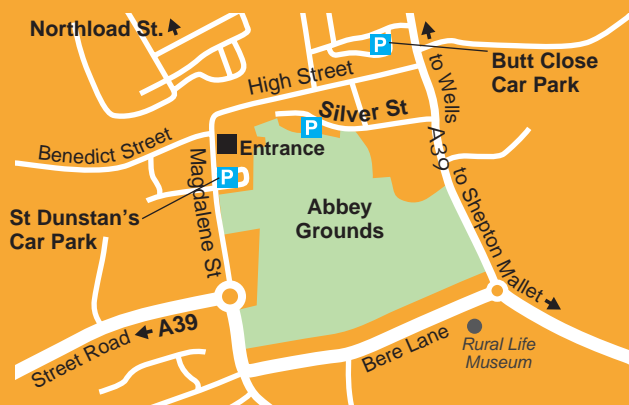

Glastonbury Abbey welcomes group bookings from all over the world. Please contact info@glastonburyabbey.com to discuss your group's needs.

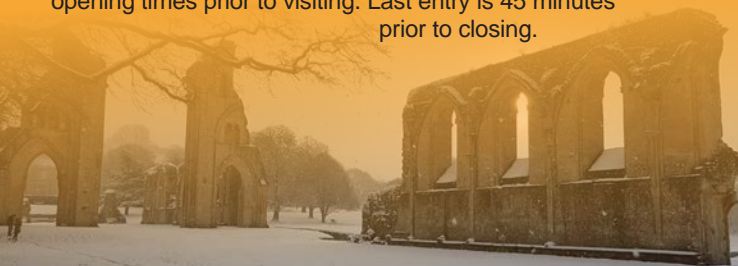


Car Parking
