In case of emergency

Fire:

On arrival, please note the position of fire exits and fire extinguishers in the various buildings. In the unlikely event of a fire you are either to take your group to the fire assembly point or follow the directions given by a member of the abbey staff. Please ensure you can account for all members of your group at all times.

Fire Assembly Point:

The fire assembly point is located in the main driveway, next to the car park entrance. It is marked with the standard muster area sign.
